1st Place CA IRA, 28' Triton sloop, Kristen White, corrected time 6860.34 seconds


2nd Place: HORNPIPE, 30' Allied Seawind ketch, Gull Gauld, corrected time 6861.72 seconds

WRITTEN DIRECTIONS to Annual Fall Meeting

From Route 50 East:
