
CTSA Annual Summer Picnic

1st Annual Fireworks Cruise ~

we were awakened at 0400 by crashes of thunder and an impressive fireworks display from the heavens. In a flurry of activity removing wind

scoops, closing hatches, and reversing vents, we decided to break the raft in half. *PEGASUS* motored off with *CA IRA*. Of course, after all our preparations, no significant wind materialized, but we did get lots and lots of rain.



The marine weather forecast for Sunday was not promising. After our nocturnal adventures, *PEGASUS* decided that discretion was the better part of valor and motored back to her mooring in Cattail Creek. *CA IRA* caught a great southwest wind and decided to head to Queenstown, which proved to be a good choice since all the thunderstorms missed her. *INTERLUDE, HORNPIPE and NIGHTSHADE* powered out of the Magothy

raft dragged their anchor and drifted between *HORNPIPE* and *INTERLUDE*. When the weather calmed down, the fireworks went off with a great bang. It was an impressive show. When it was over, *HORNPIPE* raised her anchor and headed back to Chase Creek; *INTERLUDE* headed back to Maynadier. *NIGHTSHADE*

spent the night tied up to the dock and departed Monday morning.

Despite very little wind when we wanted it and lots of wind when we didn't, the Fireworks Cruise was enjoyed by all.
