FOR THE FOURTH ANNUAL CLASSIC WOODEN SAILBOAT RENDEZVOUS & RACE

The Classic "R&R" has hosted boats from 8 to 60 feet in length, and is open to any wooden-hulled boat in that range designed before 1970 (even a newer wooden boat from an old design is eligible).

Wooden sailboats, including: Penguins, Thistles,
Jet 14s, Stars, Lightnings, Beetle Cats, Windmills,
Chesapeake 20s, Scow, Hamptons, Moths, Snipes,
Comets, even wooden dories and prams like Optis, El
Toros and Sneakboxes can all join in and sail
alongside classic yachts, including the sandbaggers
BULL and BEAR and larger classic yachts like
WINDALIER and ELF.

A pursuit start and a Portsmouth Yardstick handicapping system modified for classic boats will keep everything even, so your wooden Opti has a chance of winning!
